



Both symbols can be used to clear the energy of yourself and of your environment

Visualise one of the symbols hanging in the middle of the room. Slowly rotating around its center. See it becoming bigger and emanating bright golden light until it encompasses the whole room. See the lines of the symbol catching misplaced energies and transforming them into bright golden light. See the symbol getting smaller again and dissolve. You can repeat this procedure a number of times.

Ganesha statue maintenance: Clean regurarely Burn a candle and incense stick

A simple Ganesh puja

Needed: a puja tray with a red flower, sweets, incense, lamp, rice.

Take care of a clean place and clean clothes.

Take care of focus, resolve, being connected and a clear intention. Surrender all thoughts, tendencies and feelings to Ganesha.

Sing opening mantra and 108x the Ganesha mahamantra, in the meanwhile -visualising the cleaning of yourself and the statue -offering the red flower, the sweets, the incense, lamp and rice.

Thank Ganesh for his blessings.

Ganesha visualisation Warning: be precise in what you ask, it might come true!

Sit in your chair, with your spine right, being active but relaxed. Close your eyes. Watch your breath. Focus on your desire. See it in your inner eye as being realized. Imagine Ganesha standing behind you. He puts the opening of his trunk above your head. Ganesha lets the light of manifestation come out of his trunk into your head and your whole body, until it is saturated with the light of manifestation. Be with it a while. Then you ask Ganesha to blow away the blockages in your head, that stand in the way of realization of your desire. Ask Ganesha to fill your head and body again with the light of manifestation. Next Ganesha will trumpet wildly to mobilize your helpful friends, who can help you realize your desire.

-every Friday

-every fourth day after full and new moons

-Ganesha's birthday: fourth day of the bright half moon in the period of August , September
